Purpose of Role:

To teach a range of vocational Film and TV skills and units. Developing students knowledge and skills both in front and behind of the camera, ensuring that all students achieve the best of their abilities on both their practical and academic work.

- Inspire and engage all students through well-planned lessons and enrichment activities.
- Work actively to create an ethos that promotes equality, celebrates cultural and academic diversity and ensures the inclusion of students of all abilities, including those with special educational needs.
- Establish good relationships with students that promote progress, develops confidence and a positive attitudes to learning.
- Contribute to a well-constructed and well-taught curriculum that facilitates excellent attendance, retention and achievement.
- Inspire and engage students through well-planned and expertly delivered schemes of work, mid-term plans and lessons that ensures the progress of all students.
- Use data, including prior attainment, to plan lessons and learning materials.
- Have high expectations and set appropriate challenges for all students.
- Regularly assess and monitor student progress using the College's reporting system and in accordance with awarding body criteria and regulations.
